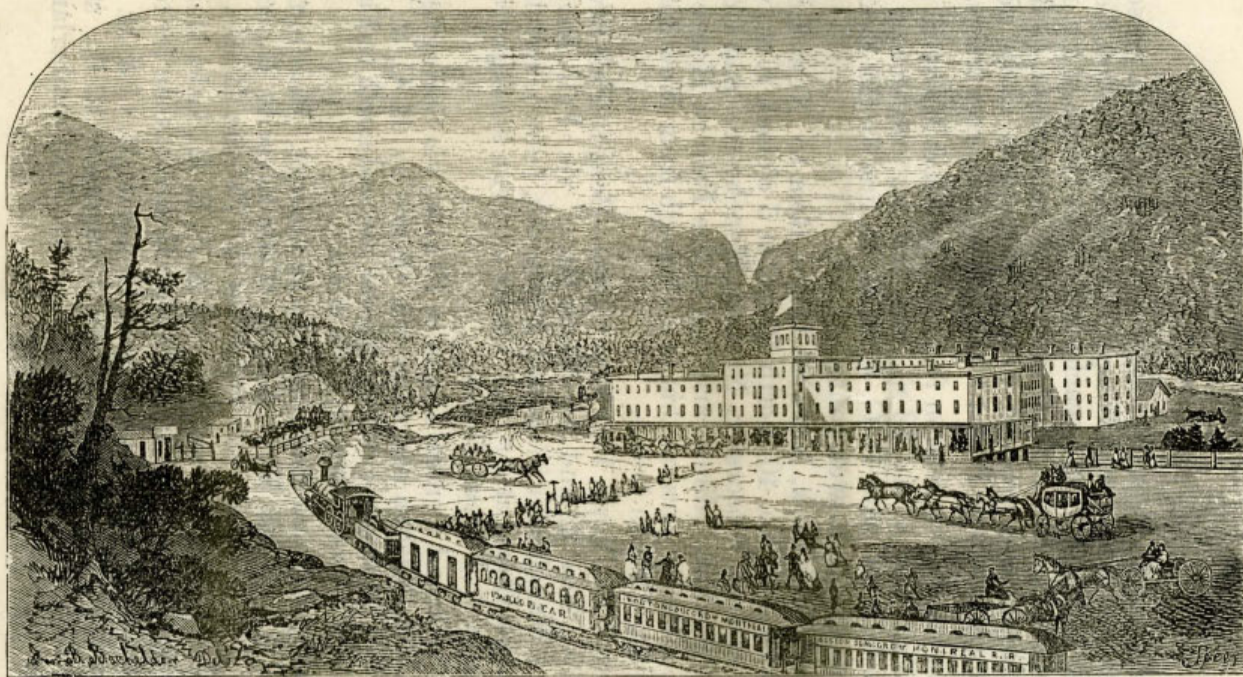

This House can well accommodate four hundred guests. The rooms are large, high studded, lighted with gas, and furnished throughout with elegant and costly furniture. Telegraph and Post Office in the house, and mails arrive daily from Boston and New York.

ROUTES.

Cars leave Boston from Boston & Lowell R. R. passenger Station at 8 A. M. (through express), via Boston, Concord & Montreal R. R., reaching Fabyan House at 4 P. M.; also, at 12 M., and 6 P. M., (express), via same route, (lodge at Plymouth and proceed to the Mountains early next morning.) Elegant Parlor Cars on these express trains.

Also, cars leave Boston from the Boston & Maine R. R. Station at 7.30 A. M., 12 M., and 5 P. M., connecting at Concord, N. H. with B. C. & M. R. R. line for the Mountains, as by the Lowell route.

Leave New York, Norwich Line—Boat to New London, from pier No. 40 North River, at 5 o'clock P. M., via New London, Worcester, Nashua, Manchester and Concord, Plymouth, (dine), arriving at the Fabyan House at 4 P. M. Parlor cars on this line through from New London to the Fabyan house.

Leave New York, Fall River Line—Boat to Fall River from Pier Nos. 28 and 30 North River via Fall River, Nashua, Manchester, Concord, Plymouth, (dine), arriving at Fabyan House at 4 P. M. Parlor cars run through from Fall River to Fabyan House.

Leave Grand Central Depot at 10 A. M., via Springfield, Worcester, Nashua and Concord, thence by B. C. & M. R. R. to Plymouth, (lodge), thence proceed north to Fabyan House by morning or noon train.

Passengers from Saratoga, Lake George, Burlington and St. Albans via Montpelier & Wells River R. R., connect at Wells River with trains for the Fabyan House.

Leave Montreal in morning via S. E. R. R., Lake Memphremagog, (dine) arrive at Fabyan House in time for tea.

All trains to and from Fabyan House on B. C. & M. R. R. connect at Wells River with Passumpsic R. R., and Montpelier & Wells River R. R. At Northumberland, with the Grand Trunk Railway.
